## Speakers

1. Fr Demetrios Andrews: Sacred Space

Fr Demetrios is Proistamenos of St Augustine's, Denver. Currently studying for a Ph.D. at CU, Denver on the topic of sacred space, he is also an iconographer, as well as working as a consultant on religious architecture.

2. Fr Joseph-Marie Brown, OSB: The History and Theology of Iconography
